RESPONSE OF THE CITIZENS COMMITTEE FOR THE  
PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT TO APPLICANTS MOTION FOR  
ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE AUTHORIZING LIMITED OPERATION

The Citizens Committee for the Protection of the Environment is opposed to issuance of any license authorizing operation of this plant at any level. The basis for that objection is now on the record and will be further developed during the remainder of the radiological safety hearings. It is clear from Applicants Motion that it believes as we do that the question of issuance of the proposed license is to be determined on the basis of the entire evidentiary record respecting radiological safety and not before completion of that record. See Paragraph 6 of Applicants Motion.

When all of the evidence has been received we reserve the right to request that this Board delay a final determination on the issuance of the limited operating authorization pending presentation of proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law. At that time




