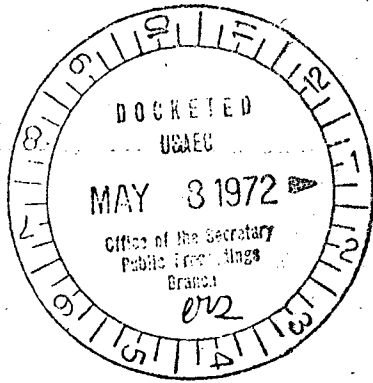

Dear Mr. Chairman:

This is in reference to your letter of May 2, regarding the May 17 hearing. We have had an opportunity to examine the data disclosed at the deposition of Mr. Brill. We do not presently intend to request Mr. Brill's attendance at the May 17 hearing although we will offer into evidence portions of the deposition transcript and exhibits assuming they are not offered by other parties. If Mr. Brill does attend the hearing and is subject to questioning, we reserve our right to ask any questions which the inquiry raises.

In your letter you indicated that the Board was intending to "utilize the dates of May 22 and 23 to further consider the matter of the requested testing license for Indian Point No. 2." I assume this referred to private consultations among the Board members and not a public hearing. If the latter is intended, I will not be able to attend a hearing (barring a change in my present obligations) that week as I explained in my letter of May 1 to the Board.
