In connection with Applicant's motion to strike certain testimony of Dr. Philip Goodyear, (Tr. 9332-9333 and letter to Board dated January 24, 1973) there is enclosed a copy of an affidavit dated February 1, 1973 submitted by Angus Macbeth, Esq. in support of a petition dated February 2, 1973 filed by the Hudson River Fishermen's Association with the Federal Power Commission for a hearing and order regulating the Cornwall pumped storage project.
