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

Dear Mr. Chairman:

There have been problems with the distribution of the Final Environmental Impact Statement on Indian Point Unit No. 2. Counsel for Con Edison agreed to provide a number of copies for me as soon as they were available and on that basis, I agreed to the schedule set out in Mr. Trosten's letter to you of September 15, 1972. Con Edison did not receive the number of copies of the Statement which it anticipated and, as a result, I received only two copies until today. This has set the intervenors back in beginning work on the tight schedule to which we agreed.

I have discussed this situation with Mr. Trosten, and he has agreed with me that the schedule presented in his letter of September 29, 1972 should be amended to allow for this delay. I attach hereto the amended schedule.

Accordingly, HRFA respectfully requests the Board that any order issued establishing a schedule for this proceeding follow the times set out in the attached schedule which is satisfactory to both the Applicant and HRFA and EDF.

Anthony Z. Roisman joins me in this letter on behalf of EDF.

PROPOSED SCHEDULE FOR FURTHER
PROCEEDINGS FOR A FULL-TERM,
FULL-POWER OPERATING LICENSE

<u>Date</u>	<u>Event</u>
October 2, 1972	Service of Final Detailed Statement by Staff.
October 16, 1972	The parties will submit a statement of legal contentions and issues, if any, which must be determined in the hearing together with supporting briefs.
October 30, 1972	The parties may file answering briefs concerning legal issues. The parties will submit proposed testimony, the names of witnesses and their statements of factual contentions and matters in controversy. Stipulations among the parties will also be submitted.
November 13, 1972	The parties will submit supplemental statements of contentions and matters in controversy based on the testimony submitted on October 30, 1972.
November 20, 1972	A prehearing conference will be held in Washington, D. C. to consider, inter alia, the contentions submitted by the parties, to rule on legal issues and to define the factual issues for the hearing. Based on this conference, the Board will issue an appropriate order. Not less than 48 hours prior to the prehearing conference there will be filed the names of witnesses and subjects for proposed cross-examination and the expected duration of such cross-examination.
December 4, 1972	Hearing begins.
