

Dear Mr. Chairman:

The zero power phase of the testing program has been successfully completed. On June 8, 1973 steam was admitted to the main steam system for testing of various secondary system components at reactor power levels up to 20 percent of full power and the turbine generator was brought up to rated speed in preparation for synchronization of the main generator to the system. Synchronization did not take place, however, due to the need for adjustment of turbine controls, and the reactor was brought to a shutdown condition in order to complete such adjustments.

In accordance with your letter dated April 30, 1973 future reports concerning the testing program will be provided periodically, although not necessarily weekly.
