

Dear Mr. Chairman:

Applicant, the Regulatory Staff and CCPE have agreed as follows with respect to the radiological issues in this proceeding:

1. CCPE will not introduce additional evidence nor will it cross-examine further with respect to CCPE's contentions on fuel densification and thin-walled valves.
2. The Applicant will revise page 9 of the "Additional Testimony of Applicant on Fuel Densification and Its Effects," dated April 13, 1973, when it is offered into evidence at the forthcoming hearing session to delete the last sentence on the page and to place the footnote at the end of the second sentence on the page. A revised page 9 is enclosed herewith.

On the basis of CCPE's review of the Applicant's "Analysis of High Energy Lines" submitted with our letter to Mr. Giambusso dated April 9, 1973, the answer given by Mr. Cahill to Mr. Roisman's question (Tr. 11,021-23) and the Staff response to Mr. Roisman's question (letter from Mr. Karman to Mr. Roisman dated April 20, 1973) CCPE no longer has a contention with respect to rupture of water and steam lines outside the containment. Accordingly, CCPE will not submit proposed findings or conclusions on this contention.

4. Except for the formal receipt into evidence of documents, no evidentiary hearings on radiological issues need be held during the week commencing April 24 and a schedule for findings and conclusions on radiological issues pertaining to the full-term, full-power license for this facility should be set at the conclusion of that session.

Additional Information on Sensitivity
Studies Supplied by Westinghouse to The
Regulatory Staff

Westinghouse submitted to the Regulatory Staff, within the context of the latter's review of the license application for Point Beach Unit No. 2, sensitivity studies of a generic nature relating to fuel densification analyses. The studies submitted together with other analyses and data demonstrate that the parameters related to densification effects were appropriately and adequately considered in the evaluation of the effects of densification on the operation of the Indian Point Unit No. 2 reactor.^{1/}
