MOTION OF AEC REGULATORY STAFF FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE RESPONDING BRIEF

The regulatory staff hereby moves for an extension of time within which to file its responding briefs to the exceptions taken by the applicant, intervenors, and the State of New York. The staff requests an extension of time until December 3, 1973, to file responding briefs to exceptions of CCPE, and December 10, 1973, to file responding briefs to exceptions of all other parties.

The voluminous record of the proceeding, and number of involved exceptions from all parties which must be dealt with in the regulatory staff's responding briefs makes it impossible for the regulatory staff to submit adequately-prepared briefs within the time frame for filing them. For the foregoing reasons, the staff believes that good cause exists for granting this extension of time.


