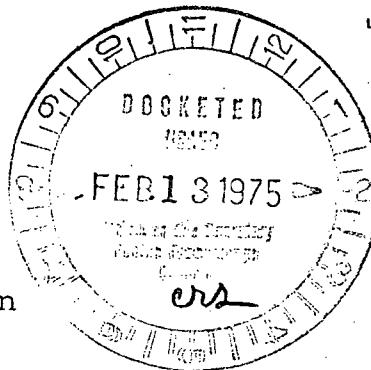

Dear Chairman Jensch:

In response to your letter of January 24, 1975, we would appreciate it if you and the other members of the Board would return to us all of the Westinghouse documents (proprietary and non-proprietary) which have a "WCAP" designation. These documents are needed, incidentally, for reference purposes.

We would have no objection to the destruction of all other proprietary material, as well as Indian Point 2 security plan materials, in the possession of members of the Board. Please confirm to us that such materials have been destroyed.

Although your letter requested a list of the documents we wish returned, we respectfully request the Board members simply to send us those WCAP documents which they have. This seems to us to be the most efficient way of dealing with the matter. It would be helpful, however,

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if the letter or letters of transmittal listed the documents which were being forwarded.
