

RESPONSE OF AEC REGULATORY STAFF  
TO APPEAL BOARD ORDER OF JULY 31, 1974

On July 31, 1974, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board (Appeal Board) issued an order requiring, among other things, that the Staff file and serve, on or before August 16, 1974, affidavits with respect to:  
(1) evidence of site inspections to verify full implementation of the Security Plan at Indian Point Station, Unit #2; (2) identification of areas outside the plant considered by the Staff for security purposes; and (3) a statement concerning the freezer-dryer issue which has been raised in this case. On August 16, 1974 in response to a motion so requesting, the Appeal Board extended the Staff's time to respond until August 23, 1974.

The affidavit of Martin J. King, Physical Security Inspector, Directorate of Regulatory Operations, Region I, dated August 8, 1974, is appended hereto in support of the attached Inspection Report 50-247/74-12 as evidence of a site inspection to verify full implementation of the Indian Point Security Plan.


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An affidavit of Mr. King, dated August 8, 1974, supporting the Staff response identifying the areas outside the plant considered by the Staff for security purposes is also attached herewith.

With respect to the freezer-dryer issue, the Staff, on July 31, 1974, in responding to the July 26, 1974 submission of the Citizens' Committee for Protection of the Environment, stated that the Engineering Service Report (ESR) referred to in the July 19, 1974 Staff response is the same report "which was originally proposed to evaluate the freezer-dryer problems."

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
