

Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing as attorney for the Hudson River Fishermen's Association in response to the public notice of the "Proposed Issuance of Amendment to Facility Operating License Opportunity for Hearing for Indian Point Nuclear Generating Unit 2" appearing in the July 23, 1975 Federal Register.

The Hudson River Fishermen's Association was a party to the facility operating license proceedings for Indian Point Unit No. 2. The Hudson River Fishermen's Association is interested in the proposed issuance by the NRC of an amendment to that license approving the licensee's determination that a closed-cycle natural draft wet cooling tower system is the preferred alternative closed-cycle cooling system for installation at Indian Point Unit No. 2.

The Hudson River Fishermen's Association does not contest the proposed action and, therefore, has not filed a request for an adjudicatory hearing. Should any other party or person whose interest may be affected by the contemplated action request a hearing, HRFA hereby formally requests that it be given immediate notice by the NRC of that action. If such a request is made, HRFA presently plans to intervene in those proceedings. HRFA does not view its decision not to request
