

REQUEST FOR A HEARING

Pursuant to § 2.105(d)(1) of the Rules of Practice of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, 10 C.F.R. § 2.105(d)(1) (1975), and the Notice of Availability of Licensee's Environmental Report, Notice of Proposed Issuance of Amendment to Facility Operating License and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing issued on September 24, 1975, 40 Fed. Reg. 45874 (1975), Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison"), as holder of Facility Operating License No. DPR-26, hereby requests a hearing with respect to its application for a facility license amendment filed on June 6, 1975, and urges that the hearing be held in the vicinity of Indian Point.

At the hearing, Con Edison will urge that the relief requested in its application for a facility license


amendment be granted. That application seeks a two-year extension of the period of interim operation of the facility using the installed once-through cooling system. Submission of the application was in accordance with Paragraph 2.E.(1)(c) of the License.

The need for a hearing will, from Con Edison's point of view, be obviated if the Regulatory Staff determines that the relief sought in the application for an amendment to Facility Operating License No. DPR-26 should be granted without change. If the Regulatory Staff so concludes, then the instant request for a hearing is to be considered withdrawn. If, however, any other requests for a hearing are filed, then Con Edison will appear at and participate in the hearing (if one is granted) in support of the amendment for which Con Edison has applied.


