Dear Mr. Anders:

In your letter to the New York Times of February 19, 1976, you state that your technical staff "has just completed a detailed evaluation of Mr. Pollard's charges and has found no need for regulatory action." You also state that the Commission has directed the review of all such charges by the Advisory Committee.

The Attorney General of the State of New York was a party to the Indian Point #2 proceeding, and has maintained a continuing interest in reconciling the environmental and energy needs of the public. Attorney General Lefkowitz, like many other citizens, is disturbed by the thrust of Mr. Pollard's assertions, and would appreciate a detailed rebuttal by the Commission.

Accordingly, could you please send this office a copy of the "detailed evaluation" referred to in your letter to the Times, and inform us as to when the Advisory Committee's public report will be released?
