STAFF MOTION FOR PRODUCTION AND INSPECTION OF DOCUMENTS
IN THE POSSESSION OF THE CITIZEN'S COMMITTEE
FOR PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT

On January 16, 1976, the Citizen's Committee for Protection of the Environment (CCPE) answered interrogatories propounded by the NRC Staff (Staff). CCPE designated Dr. Mihailo Trifunac, California Institute of Technology, to testify on the issues of appropriate ground acceleration value produced by the Safe Shutdown Earthquake.

In accordance with 10 CFR §2.741, the Staff requests production of the following documents in the possession of Dr. Trifunac which are relevant to his computations and permission to inspect those documents:

1. All plots and documents used in derivation of the Trifunac and Brady relationship between acceleration and intensity.

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- All documents relating to Dr. Trifunac's choice of a normal, rather than a log-normal distribution for acceleration data.
- 3. All documents relating to Dr. Trifunac's choice of log-linear regression on means of acceleration as opposed to simple log-linear regression on the data set.

The Staff requests that the documents described above be produced by CCPE and that the Staff be permitted to inspect such documents during the normal business hours on or before February 27, 1976, or at such time or place mutually convenient to the parties.
