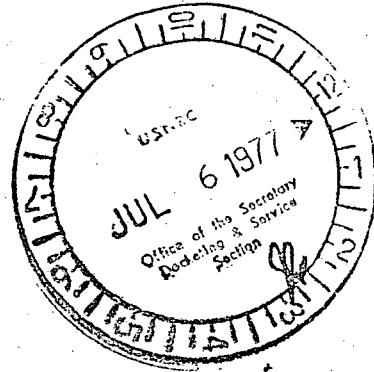

We note that your June 16, 1977 response to HRFA's application for a partial stay of ALAB-399 contained an assumption that execution of contracts and clearing of land for a cooling tower have already been accomplished. Response, p. 3, n. 4. In order to be sure that no one has any misunderstanding on this point, Con Edison wishes to advise you that this assumption is in error. Con Edison has determined that proceeding with these steps at this time would be imprudent.
