Gentlemen:

On behalf of the Steering Committee and members of R.C.S.E., may I inform you of our very serious concerns with regard to Indian Point Unit 2. Having followed closely events, hearings and the NRC's own investigative reporting subsequent to the October 1980 leak, I must admit to more than my usual apprehension at the continued operation of that unit. The recent small malfunctions do not enhance a general picture of ineptitude on the part of Consolidated Edison in operation of the reactor, and for the small portion of the area's power which comes from that unit, the risks are simply unacceptable. We in Rockland County, directly across the Hudson, receive none of the benefits yet all of the risks.

We ask you, once again, as you have been asked before, please do not allow Indian Point Unit 2 to go back on line before completion of the promised Adjudicatory Hearings.


