I rather have my lights blink a few times than become part of a nuclear catastrophe!

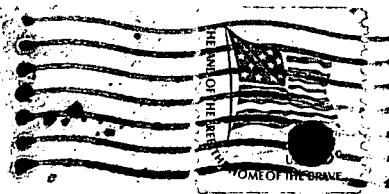
I am a reasonable, rational person and not prone to hysteria. But enough of this:
