As you surely know, Consolidated Edison's Indian Point power plant recently experienced an accident in which 100,000 gallons of water leaked onto the floor of the containment building.

As a result of this accident the plant is currently shutdown. I urge you to keep the plant shut down. Con Ed has shown that it does not have any regard for the safety of the public. It cannot be trusted to operate a facility in which there is a question of plant safety.

In light of the upcoming hearings about the Indian Point nuclear reactors it only makes sense to keep the plant shut down until its future can be decided. I hope that the hearings can be used as a forum where the issues can be thoroughly discussed and members of the public can express their concerns.

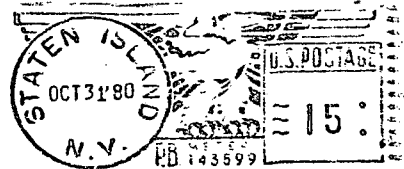
