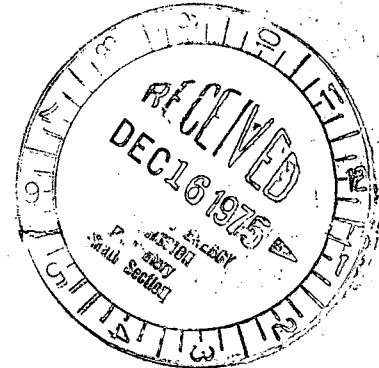

Pursuant to Appendix B of Unit No. 2 Technical Specifications with respect to the operation of our Unit Nos. 1 and 2, a tabulation of daily record of fish collections at Indian Point Unit No. 2 for the month of November is enclosed herewith. A daily species breakdown and total daily weights are also included. Subsequent to the impingement total of 7,780 on November 3 (third consecutive day over 5,000) circulators 21 and 23 were shutdown. This resulted in a power reduction of 80 MWe. Subsequent to the impingement total of 9,935 on November 4 (fourth consecutive day over 5,000), circulator 26 was shutdown. This resulted in further reduction of 560 MWe. Subsequent to the impingement total at 5,999 on November 20 (third consecutive day over 5,000) circulator 21 was shutdown. This resulted in a power reduction of 10 MWe. Because the circulators at Unit No. 1 were shutdown the entire month, there were no fish collections made.
