Subject: Resolving Visteon's Tritium Exit Signs

Hello Sheryl: this email is in response to our conversation just moments ago. As I explained in that conversation, NRC has verified that with regard to Visteon's tritium exit signs, our current information was drawn from an older database. The information drawn is not accurate, so it would not be very useful to you. However, the fact that this information is old indicates that the associated signs themselves are past their useful life, and Visteon therefore, likely disposed of them.

NRC offers this suggestion to close out this issue. Please contact the manufacturer(s) and request that they verify that the signs they sold to Visteon are old and likely at the end of their useful life. After obtaining that confirmation, please contact me. Explain that the manufacturer confirmed that the signs were old and likely past their useful life, and therefore, to the best of Visteon's knowledge and belief, Visteon disposed of the signs. Furthermore, since Visteon did not purchase any new signs, Visteon has no tritium exit signs in its possession.

That should close out this action. All the above can be done via email. Let me know if you have any further questions.
