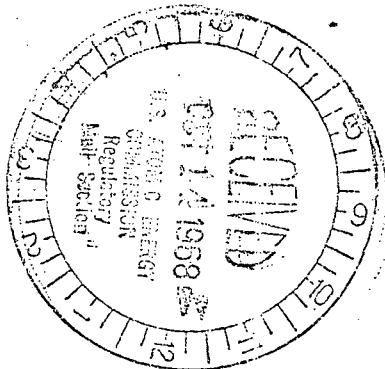

Dear Mr. Price:

In response to your request of September 25, 1968, for the comments of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation concerning the application for a construction permit and facility license to authorize construction and operation of a pressurized water nuclear reactor at Indian Point site in Westchester County, the Council has considered the effect of this undertaking on the Stony Point Battlefield Reservation, a National Register property.

In accordance with its procedures, the Council has received an evaluation of the effect of the Indian Point Unit No. 3 at the proposed site and has reached the conclusion that the probable effect upon the Stony Point Battlefield Reservation cannot be judged to be sufficiently adverse to warrant Council comment.
