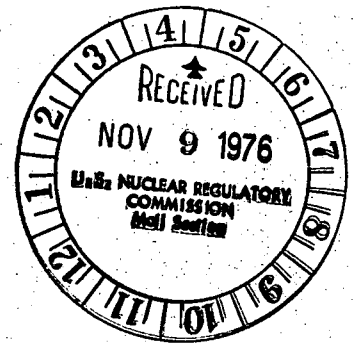

APPLICATION FOR AMENDMENT TO  
OPERATING LICENSE

Pursuant to Section 50.90 of the regulations of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. ("Con Edison"), in its own right and as agent for Power Authority of the State of New York as joint holders of Facility Operating License No. DPR-64, hereby applies for an amendment to the Indian Point Unit No. 3 Technical Specifications contained in Appendix A to that license.

Specifically Con Edison requests revisions to sections 6.2, 6.5.1, 6.6 and 6.9.2 to reflect pending organizational changes and to require written notification of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) within thirty (30) days of any subsequent change in the organizational structures shown on Figures 6.2-1 and 6.2-2 or specified in section 6.5.1.2. The proposed changes to Figure 6.2-2 contained herein supersede those changes requested by application sworn to on August 26, 1976.

The proposed Technical Specification changes consist of


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the specific revisions set forth in Attachment A to this Application. A safety evaluation of the proposed changes is set forth in Attachment B to this Application. This evaluation demonstrates that the proposed changes do not represent a significant hazards consideration and will not cause any change in the types or increase in the amounts of effluents or any change in the authorized power level of the facility.


