I have been asked my opinion on the proposed additional nuclear generating plant at Indian Point, N. Y.


As a recreation and parks executive operating in the area served by the present plant, I wish to indicate my complete support of this proposal. This position is based upon two factors:

2. Deep concern for the critical state of our environmental health, as related to smoke and air pollution.

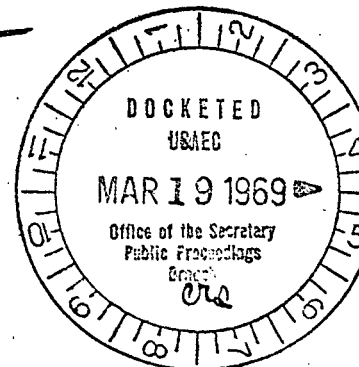
The proposed atomic plant will help to meet the need for power, and it assures us all that further air pollution resulting from conventional fuel-burning power production will be avoided.

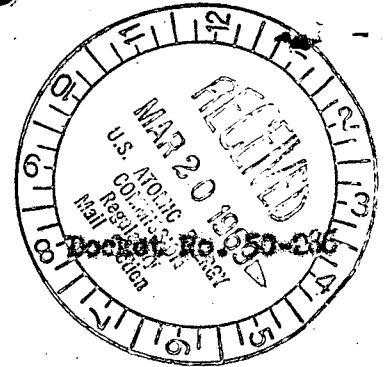
