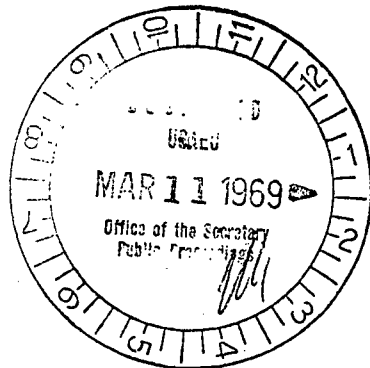

I would like to make a limited appearance at the hearing on Consolidated Edison's Application for Provisional Construction Permit March 25, 1969, in the Hendrick Hudson High School because I feel that my health and safety will be affected by the construction of Indian Point No. 2. I am basing this attitude because of a statement made by Dr. Ronald Stewart, meteorologist, with the State University of New York, Albany. He said that in the case of an increase in the amount of radio-active gases discharged from this plant, we in Southern Westchester would be in danger of an undue amount of radiation due to the prevailing winds carrying this fallout to New Rochelle.
