Dear Mr. Muntzing:

I have filed a notice of appearance with the Commission in the above matter on behalf of the Citizens Committee for the Protection of the Environment and the Cortlandt Conservation Association, Inc. Unlike Anthony Z. Roisman, Esq., who has represented CCPE with respect to Unit No. 2, I have the misfortune, from a procedural viewpoint, of living far from AEC headquarters. It is to raise problems connected with my location that this letter is directed thus to solicit your assistance and suggestions.

My objective must be to represent my clients in a responsible fashion in proceedings before the Commission. To do so requires that all of my submissions be prepared in timely fashion in accordance with regulations. Without a Federal Register readily available (I doubt there is one in all of Westchester County) it is difficult to obtain notice of the various decisions and other matters concerning the above subject without time delays which seriously affect my ability to prepare as prescribed.

Accordingly, I am requesting hereby that all notices and other pertinent documents issued by the AEC in this matter be furnished me as close to their publication as is possible, so that I can take immediate steps on my clients' behalves. If this request conforms with Commission policy please reflect same upon your records. If it does not so conform I would appreciate your advice in the matter.


I raise this issue specifically because on November 30, 1971 I mailed to the Commission's Division of Reactor Licensing comments pertaining to the suspension issue on Unit No. 3. I did not know at the time, of course, that your decision not to suspend had issued November 26, 1971, a fact which obviously would have avoided unnecessary steps. I enclose a separate letter directed to that situation.
