Dear Mr. Giambusso,

On or about November 1, 1972, my secretary, Miss Sandra Powell, called your office and requested that you send me the documents listed in the Federal Register Notice of October 25, 1972 dealing with the Notice of Opportunity for Hearing on Indian Point Unit No. 3: (1) Report of the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards, (3) Commission's final detailed statement on environmental considerations, (4) Safety evaluation, and (5) Proposed facility operating license. Last week, I received all of these documents for the Indian Point Unit No. 2 licensing proceeding.

As you know, I represented the Hudson River Fishermen's Association in the Indian Point Unit No. 2 proceeding and I was requesting the documents concerning Indian Point Unit No. 3 so that my client could consider the advisability of intervening in that proceeding. Of course, my clients need the Indian Point Unit No. 3 documents and not the Indian Point Unit No. 2 documents, in order to reach a judgment on filing a petition on intervention. Let me request again that you send to me immediately all the available documents on Indian Point Unit No. 3. My clients hope to be able to file a timely petition, but, frankly, they have been prejudiced by this error in the Commission, and it will be difficult, if not impossible, for them to file the petition on the due date.
