



Dear Mr. Jensch:

The Striped Bass Fund respectfully requests permission for a limited appearance at the hearings scheduled to begin with a pre-hearing conference May 21, 1973.

We are an organization with directors in every state supporting a coastal striped bass fishery with somewhere in excess of 2,500 sponsors. Although the organization has been in existence for only four months, it is a natural outgrowth of the individual concerns of a myriad of groups who are striped bass fishermen, who are serious about their sport, and who are willing to support an organization whose function it is to fund research, education, and, where necessary, to help with litigation to protect the striped bass fishery. It is clearly our policy that the needs for power can and must be met. It is our understanding and belief that such need can be met by modern technology without enormous damage to the coastal fisheries.
