Dear Mr. Muller:

This is in reply to your letter dated September 27, 1973, concerning the furnishing of certificates under Section 401 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. I would like to assure you that Con Edison is very much aware of this requirement and is taking all action possible to assure that certifications are received on a timely basis and in such a way that it will not delay the Atomic Energy Commission in issuing operating licenses for the subject plants.

As you know, certification for Indian Point No. 2 was received on September 24, 1973. The application for a certification for Unit No. 3 was filed on October 4, 1973.

In view of the approach taken by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to these certificates, I believe it is not prudent to file an application for Unit No. 1 until the proceeding for a full term operating license has advanced considerably beyond its present stage. Section 401 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act requires a certification with respect to compliance with rules promulgated under specified sections of that Act. These rules have not yet been promulgated, but it is anticipated that such rules will be promulgated during the next few years. Accordingly, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation is reluctant to issue a certification now for a license which will not be issued until a future time because it is not presently known what the applicable standards will be at



the time the Federal license is issued.

Therefore, at this stage of implementation of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, it is not feasible to obtain a certification "well before preparation by the staff of its draft environmental statement." It is my hope that this will change once the water quality standards and limitations referred to in Section 401 are promulgated.
