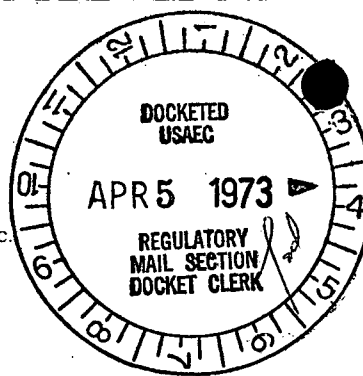

Informal conversations between Dr. Webb Van Winkle of Oak Ridge National Laboratory and members of my staff have indicated a mutual interest in meeting to discuss the strengths and weaknesses of past mathematical models for the impact of Indian Point plant operation on Hudson River fisheries. Other topics such as compensation and the contribution of the Hudson River to the Mid-Atlantic Striped Bass Population may also be discussed. It is hoped that the information exchanged at this meeting will be of mutual assistance in developing new models.

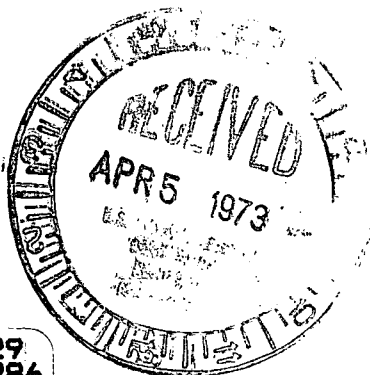
