SUMMARY

- A. On October 1, 2007, the NRC published a Federal Register Notice informing licensees of amendments to the NRC's regulation regarding the possession and use of Naturally occurring and Accelerator produced Radioactive Materials (NARM) – placed NARM, i.e. Ra-226, under NRC's jurisdiction.

On March 18, 2008, the NRC published a Notice of Waiver Termination for licensees in the State of Missouri which stated, in part, that the NRC was terminating the waiver for persons possessing accelerator-produced radioactive material or discrete sources of radium-226 on September 30, 2008. The Notice further stated that the final rule allowed an additional twelve month period from the effective date of the final rule to apply for a new license, i.e., September 30, 2009.

- B. **From our conversation on January 20, 2010, we have agreed that this application is to be voided.** This is done without prejudice. Please note that a "void" is an administrative procedure that puts your application "on hold" (takes it out of our active casework database) until you reactivate it via submission of a written response.

From our review of your application dated November 18, 2009 (with NRC Form 313 and attachments), and facsimile dated January 15, 2010, we need additional information as follows:

1. For Item 5, we now require a **total possession limit** for each radionuclide requested. It is acceptable to request more sealed sources than you may actually need immediately, to allow for some growth, so long as the request is reasonable and realistic.

From facsimile dated January 15, 2010, please withdraw your request for Seaman Nuclear Corporation Models C-300 and C-75.

2. For Item 7, you will not be able to change and name your RSO internally; NRC must do that for you via the amendment process. Each proposed RSO must be qualified in accordance with the guidance in NUREG 1556, Vol 1, Rev. 1, Section 8.7, Item 7: Individual(s) Responsible for Radiation Safety Program and Their Training and Experience.

Please provide the training certificate of your proposed RSO and a written, signed and dated statement that stipulates your proposed RSO accepts the RSO position and understands the duties and responsibilities associated with the position. See enclosed sample document.

C. Also, noted:

1. Please verify if you will be using these portable gauges at temporary job-sites.

Please provide a signed written response with control number 318676 by February 4, 2010, or contact me if you need to respond by an alternative date.

Also, be reminded of the provisions in 10 CFR 30.9(a) where the information you provide to the NRC “shall be complete and accurate in all material respects.”

We will continue processing your request when we receive this information. In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC’s “Rules of Practice,” a copy of this letter will be available electronically in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Record (PARS) component of NRC’s document system (ADAMS) accessible from the NRC Website at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rem/adams.html>.

Memo To: Radiation Safety Officer
From: Chief Executive Officer (or Executive Management)
Subject: Delegation of Authority

You, _____, have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. You are responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program, identifying radiation protection problems; initiating, recommending, or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you will spend _____ hours per week conducting radiation protection activities.
