- 3. To be a leader or manager of people (38%)

- Collaborates with Universities
  University "Champions" Program
- Maintains a strong "cooperative" program for students
  - Student Career Experience Program, summer internships
  - Offers competitive compensation
    - Salaries, student loan repayment, health insurance
- Provides flexible work schedules
  - Flexible hours, work from home
- Keeps careers exciting, encourages mobility
  - Rotational programs, international opportunities



- Utilizes social networking and content management software
  - NRC Knowledge Center "Communities of Practice", Microsoft SharePoint
- Shares common and new practices
  - NRC 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Knowledge Management Fair
- Encourages knowledge transfer
  - Regular seminars and luncheons
- Requires reporting, documenting of knowledge
  - International trip reports, internal searchable databases and libraries

- Provides "fast-track" programs
  - Nuclear Safety Professional Development Program
  - Leadership Potential Program
- Offers formal and informal mentoring programs
- Maps out career paths with multiple avenues to achieve goals
- Supports continuous education
  - Graduate Fellowship Program, Individual Development Planning, Classroom and web-based training
