- 2. Drugs tested for and cutoff levels, including results of tests using lower cutoff levels;
- 3. Workforce population tested;
- 4. Number of tests and results by population and type of test (i.e., pre-access, random, for-cause, etc.);
- 5. Substances identified;
- 6. Summary of management actions; and
- 7. A list of events reported.

Fitness-for-Duty performance data for the Authority's James A. FitzPatrick Nuclear Power Plant for the period from January through June 1998 are provided below and in the attached tables. Data on random testing rate, a summary of management actions, and a list of events reported (items 1, 6 and 7) are given below. Data for the remaining items (2, 3, 4 and 5) are given in the attached tables.

An additional section not required by 10 CFR 26 is typically included in this report. The additional section summarizes events related to the FitzPatrick Fitness-for-Duty program and lessons learned. However, for this reporting period there were no significant program events or lessons learned. Therefore, this section is not included in this period's report.

#### **RANDOM TESTING RATE**

For this period, 26% of employees and 74% of contractors were tested randomly. The relatively high rate for contractors is an artifact of the small number of contractors presently employed and of the procedural safeguards in place to accommodate delayed testing of occasional vendors.

#### **SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS**

The Authority used the definition of "Management Actions" implicit in 10 CFR 26.27 ("Management actions and sanctions to be imposed") to determine the content of this section.

### **Pre-Access Testing**

A total of 197 pre-access tests were administered. All of these test results were negative.

### **Employee Random Testing**

The results of the 252 employee random tests were negative.

### Contractor Personnel Random Testing

A total of 163 contractors were randomly tested. The results of one test were confirmed positive for alcohol. Access was denied.

### For Cause Testing

One for cause test was administered this reporting period. The results of the testing were negative.

4/3/98 - An employee was tested following a near miss incident in the warehouse. No personal injury was involved.

### Follow-up Testing

The test results from 11 follow-up tests were negative.

### **EVENTS REPORTED**

No events were reported this testing period.

### **Pre-Access Testing**

A total of 164 pre-access tests were administered. One contractor's test was confirmed positive for cocaine. Access was denied.

### **Employee Random Testing**

The results of the 239 employee random tests were negative.

### Contractor Personnel Random Testing

The results of the 74 contractor random tests were negative.

### For Cause Testing

There were two observed behavior tests conducted during the period. The following are the reasons for the for cause tests.

2/10/98 - An employee was tested after a report of an alcohol like odor on his breath. The results of the test were negative.

4/25/98 - An employee was tested after receiving a report that the individual was using marijuana. The results of the test were negative.

### Follow-up Testing

The test results from 17 follow-up tests were negative.

### Other

This category includes tests repeated because the results of the specimen were negative but the specimen was determined by the laboratory to have either a low specific gravity or a low concentration of creatinine. The results of the 17 tests performed during this report period were negative.
