Dear Mr. Wojnas:

This letter confirms the conversation held on July 11, 1984 between Mr. Edward Eiseman of Con Edison's Telecommunications Operations and yourself during which Mr. Eiseman was advised to submit this request for additional communications circuits for the Con Edison Alternate Emergency Operations Facility (AEOF).

Con Edison has established an AEOF at the Company's Eastview Service Center, located in the town of Mount Pleasant, Westchester County, N.Y. New telephone circuits are required at this facility for communicating to the NRC in the event of a radiological incident at Indian Point when the primary EOF is unavailable and the AEOF has to be activated. Specific guidance on this subject is contained in the Region I Incident Response Supplement to NUREG-0845 and in a letter from Mr. Ronald C. Haynes, NRC Region I to me dated January 8, 1983. (EPL 83-01).

The following telephone extension circuits are needed:

GP1461/2A, NRC ENS (two sets)  
GDA02061, NRC HPN (two sets)  
88CSV51574, U.S. Gov't FTS (one set)

To assist you with this request, please find attached a layout of Con Edison's AEOF equipment locations at the Eastview Service Center.

SUBJECT: EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS AT LICENSEE AEOFs

Mr. John D. O'Toole, Vice President of Consolidated Edison Company of New York, had written to Stu Cohen on November 28, 1983, concerning the requirement for Emergency Communications System (ENS and HPN) to be located in the alternate EOF at Indian Point Nuclear Station. As a general rule, the NRC does not require such installations in the AEOF as long as arrangements have been made with the local phone company that such service can be installed in a matter of hours in the event of an actual incident. It is IRB's position that such determination should be made by each regional office on a case-by-case basis, since some AEOFs are more frequently used than others.
