

ATTACHMENT A

FFD PROGRAM SUMMARY AND MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

This report period covers Fitness-For-Duty activities at the Indian Point Station, Units 1&2, from January 1st to June 30, 1991. Plant population was again monitored and tracked to ensure that on an annual basis, the random testing was being conducted at a rate equal to at least 100 percent of the unescorted work force. During the report period, the plant was subject to a refueling and maintenance outage which significantly increased the normal plant population.

During the period, there was a total of 3524 drug tests conducted which resulted in 30 confirmed positive tests including 6 licensee employees who tested positive: four, as result of random tests taken and two during pre-badge processing. These individuals were immediately referred to the Con Edison Substance Abuse Program and satisfactorily enrolled. Five were subsequently cleared by the Medical Department and Company Medical Review Officer to return to duty and approved for unescorted access subject to required unannounced follow-up testing. One employee had tested positive for the second time and a determination was made to deny his unescorted access for at least three years. Of the six positive tests, five were for drugs and one was for alcohol. There was one Fitness-For-Duty event that required telephone contact with the NRC. This case involved a company supervisor who tested positive to drugs.

There were 24 contractor employees that tested positive, 18 were drug related and 4 involved alcohol. Two others were administratively ruled positive. One of these involved an employee who failed to report for an observed test after an unsatisfactory specimen temperature reading. The other case involved a positive test for marijuana and the contractor employee, after leaving the site, could not be contacted by the MRO. Of these 24 positive tests, there were 7 random, 16 initial or pre-badge and 1 for cause (alcohol).

Confirmed positive tests for specific substances resulted in 10 marijuana, 15 cocaine, 1 opiate, 1 Benzodiazapine and 5 alcohol. There were three cases where an individual tested positive to two different substances. The multiple positives were; marijuana and cocaine, marijuana and opiates and marijuana and benzodiazapine.
