Chairman Ahearn,

I live and work and attend school all within 20 miles of Indian Point. I feel threatened daily by the too-likely possibility of leaks and accidents, by waste transport dangers and by the impossibility of evacuation of my area or any of the region surrounding the plants. I fully support the UCS petition to close Indian Point forever. The present shutdown is hardly comforting news, as there is still the possibility of leakage and waste accidents, and the plant itself is a radioactive hazard to local residents. I urge the NRC to revoke the operating licenses of Plants 1 and 2 at Indian Point. I urge that their shutdown be made mandatory and indefinite, while hearings are held and decisions of a more permanent nature are made. Please follow the proposals made in the UCS petition;
