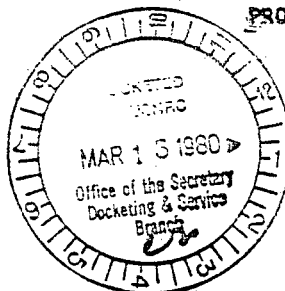

Attention: "Comment on Indian Point Decision"

Mr. Ahearn,

I am deeply concerned about
Harold Denton's decision regarding
Indian Point and the U.C.S. petition.
My main concern is over the
fact that Indian Point is still
operating, even though Mr. Denton's
and the Commissioners' decision
did not come close to dealing
with the monumental dangers
of this nuclear power plant.
If Mr. Denton cannot see that
this petition is a priority issue,
then I urge the Commissioners to
deal with each and every point
brought out by the U.C.S. The
existence of 20 million people

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is in jeopardy as long as Indian Point is kept on the line. My research into this matter has proven that N.Y.C. would still maintain an excess supply of energy if Indian Point was shutdown. I ask you, is it worth risking the life of a multitude of people, knowing that Indian Point's safety is still a critical issue, regardless of Mr. Denton's response to the U.C.S. petition? The Commissioners must do an extensive study on this issue, along with holding public adjudication hearings, and establishing an Atomic Safety and Licensing Board, to carry out the aforementioned proposals.

As a registered voter and a New York citizen, who lives within a 50 mile radius of Indian Point, I am calling for a shutdown of Indian Point, until further investigation is conducted.
