

on the application of Waste Control Specialists, LLC for Radioactive Material License No. R04100 and the order was signed on January 20, 2009. Unless a Motion for Rehearing ("MFR" or "motion") is timely filed with the chief clerk, this action of the Commission may become final. A MFR is a request for the Commission to review its decision on the matter. Any motion must explain why the Commission should review the decision. A MFR must be received by the chief clerk's office by February 20, 2009. The license will be issued after condemnation proceedings are completed and the applicant has acquired the mineral rights on the underlying land at which the site will be located.

### **Licensing Rules**

Under House Rill 1567, 78th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, Exit... a 30-day window was established — from July 8 through August 6, 2004 — for parties that intended to build lowlevel radioactive waste disposal facilities in Texas to submit an application to the TCEQ. September TCEQ issues the First Technical Notice of 16, 2005 Deficiency which provides comments and requests additional actions to resolve the noted deficiencies in the WCS application. Under separate cover, labeled "CONFIDENTIAL," the TCEQ submitting two additional attachments which request information to resolve deficiencies regarding financial information that WCS designated as "CONFIDENTIAL."

September TCEQ issues a Revision to Attachment 3 of the First Technical Notice of Deficiency. The revision adds comments that were inadvertently omitted by an editing error.

> WCS responds to the First Technical Notice of Deficiency (TNOD). Changes to the WCS License Application were enclosed as Revision 9. Responses to the first TNOD's confidential financial information, dated September 16, 2005, were provided under separate cover directly to the TCEQ Financial Administration Division.

> TCEQ issues the Second Technical Notice of Deficiency which provides comments and requests additional actions to resolve the noted deficiencies in the WCS application. Under separate cover, labeled "CONFIDENTIAL," the TCEQ issues two additional attachments which request information to resolve deficiencies regarding financial information that WCS designated as "CONFIDENTIAL."

> WCS responds to the Second Technical Notice of Deficiency (TNOD). Changes to the WCS License Application were enclosed as Revision 11. Responses to the second TNOD's confidential financial information, dated March 31, 2006, were provided under separate cover directly to the TCEQ Financial Administration Division. The Radioactive Material Licensing Team continued its technical review of the WCS application. This review was scheduled to be completed by August 31, 2006.

TCEQ issued a List of Concerns to WCS regarding unresolved license application issues. This information is needed before the application can be considered complete. WCS is now determining whether to apply for an extension of time and, if an extension is requested, what time would be needed to prepare and submit the additional information.

#### August 8, 2006

In a letter sent August 8, 2006, WCS requested an extension to the licensing process until May 31, 2007, in order to fully respond to the outstanding issues from the Second Technical Notice of Deficiency.

### August 30, 2006

TCEQ grants the extension request.

#### May 1, 2007

TCEQ officially accepts responses andrevision to the application. Changes to the WCS License Application were enclosed as Revision 12c.

#### December 10, 2007

The TCEQ submitted a Cover Letter, Initial Draft License and a Draft Licensing Order to WCS for review and comment.

# January 9, 2008

WCS submits comments on Initial Draft License and Draft Licensing Order.

#### August 11, 2008

The Executive Director files documents with the Office of the Chief Clerk.

### August 13, 2008

TCEQ Office of Chief Clerk mailed the Notice of Technical Summary and Executive Director's Preliminary Decision, Final Draft Licensing Order, Final Draft License and the Draft Environmental Analysis to Waste Control Specialists LLC and adjacent land and mineral rights owners for notice of preliminary decision. Upon WCS publishing the official TCEQ notice, the public will have 30 days to provide comment and request a hearing.

#### September 8, 2008

Public meeting in Andrews Texas on the application and preliminary decision.

### September 16, 2008

End of public comment period.

#### November 19, 2008

TCEQ Commissioners to consider mineral rights condemnation proceedings.

# November 21, 2008

The TCEQ Commission issues an order for the Executive Director to transmit a request to the Attorney General of the State of Texas to begin condemnation proceeding to acquire the mineral rights underlying land on which the low-level radioactive waste disposal facility site is proposed to be located.

# December 2, 2008

The Executive Director of the TCEQ files response to comments and proposed revised draft license with the Office of the Chief Clerk.

January 14, 2009 On January 14, 2009 the TCEQ

Commissioners approved an order granting the application of Waste Control Specialists, LLC for Radioactive Material License No. R04100. The license will be issued after condemnation proceedings are completed and the applicant has acquired the mineral rights on the underlying land at which the site will be located.

The Office of the Chief Clerk mails the Motion for Rehearing to persons on mailing list, with copies of signed licensing order and unsigned draft

license.

### AN ORDER

granting the application of Waste Control Specialists, LLC for Radioactive Material License No. R04100; TCEQ Docket No. 2005-1994-RAW

On January 14, 2009, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission) considered during its open meeting requests for hearing filed by Rose Gardner, Cruz Montañez, Nuclear Information and Resource Service, and Sierra Club concerning the application by Waste Control Specialists, LLC (Applicant) for Radioactive Material License No. R04100 to authorize the disposal of low-level radioactive waste at a site in Andrews County, Texas. The requests for hearing were evaluated under the requirements in the applicable statutes and Commission rules, including 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 55. The Commission also considered the responses to the hearing requests filed by the Executive Director, the Office of Public Interest Counsel, and the Applicant; the reply filed by Sierra Club; all timely public comment; and the Executive Director's Response to Comment.

After evaluation of all relevant filings, the Commission denied the hearing requests of Rose Gardner, Cruz Montañez, Nuclear Information and Resource Service, and Sierra Club. In addition, under Title 30 Texas Administrative Code § 336.207(4), an application for a radioactive material license authorizing disposal of low-level radioactive waste may not be approved until the applicant has acquired the title to and any interest in land and buildings,

including the surface and mineral estates, on which the facility or facilities are to be located by either having acquired:

- (A) an undivided ownership of the buildings, surface estate, and mineral estate in fee simple through purchase or completed condemnation; or
- (B) an undivided ownership of the buildings and surface estate, along with an exemption, granted by the commission in accordance with federal law for use of a surface use agreement, in lieu of acquiring fee simple title to the mineral estate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY that:

- 1. The hearing requests of Rose Gardner, Cruz Montañez, Nuclear Information and Resource Service, and Sierra Club are hereby DENIED;
- 2. The application by Waste Control Specialists, LLC for Radioactive Material License No. R04100 is granted upon a demonstration by Waste Control Specialists, LLC that the Applicant has acquired free and clear title to and all interests in land and buildings, including the surface and mineral estates, of the proposed disposal sites, as defined in Radioactive Material License No. R04100, by either having acquired:
  - (A) an undivided ownership of the buildings, surface estate, and mineral estate in fee simple through purchase or completed condemnation; or
  - (B) an undivided ownership of the buildings and surface estate, along with an exemption, granted by the Commission in accordance with federal law for use of a surface use agreement, in lieu of acquiring fee simple title to the mineral estate;

- 3. The attached Radioactive Material License No. R04100 may not be issued, signed, or granted until the demonstration required above has been provided to the Executive Director; and
- 4. If any provision, sentence, clause or phrase of this Order is for any reason held to be invalid, the invalidity of any portion shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Order.
