SUBJECT: Proposed Technical Specifications Amendment to
Revise Fire Protection Requirements

Transmitted herewith are the original and two (2) copies of an "Application for Amendment to the Operating License". This Application requests an amendment to the Indian Point Unit No. 2 Technical Specifications and a change to license condition 2.K.

The specific proposed Technical Specifications changes, set forth in Attachment A to this Application, are requested in order to revise fire protection requirements consistent with Generic Letter 88-12, "Removal of Fire Protection Requirements from Technical Specifications", and Generic Letter 86-10, "Implementation of Fire Protection Requirements". The fire protection requirements removed have, for the most part, been incorporated into the document entitled "Indian Point Unit No. 2 Fire Protection Program Plan" (FPPP), which was initially submitted to the NRC on October 13, 1987, and periodic revisions also submitted. The requirements not yet incorporated will be added, and editorial changes and corrections will be made prior to implementation of the changes requested.

Attachment B contains the proposed change to license condition 2.K, which is also requested consistent with Generic Letters 88-12 and 86-10.

A safety assessment, presented in Attachment C to this Application, provides the "No Significant Hazards Considerations" determination for the proposed amendment.

Attachment D contains the "Fire Protection System" section of the Updated Final Safety Analysis Report, which was previously submitted under the provisions of 10 CFR 50.71(e)(2).

Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.91, a copy of this Application and the associated attachments are being submitted to the designated New York State official.

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We request that these proposed Technical Specifications and license condition become implemented within 6 months after issuance of the license amendment to allow sufficient time to complete the incorporation of fire protection requirements into the FPPP, and to revise station procedures which implement the program (Station Administrative Orders) and which cite the Technical Specifications sections.
