I didn't actually evaluate it from what they needed from my view - I evaluated how they came up with their number and made sure they addressed everything they needed to. In my mind, I think I came up with a rough 10.5 FTE - I'll have to re-look at that.

Now, with John being out this week and next Monday and Tuesday, how will that affect RI concurrence? To keep on schedule, we needed to try to have concurrence by COB 7/29/09 and get all the changes made and to division no later than 8/5/09. I think working 7/30 and 31 might be ok, but any changes have to go through OGC and Joan will be out on Friday afternoon, and for the next 2 weeks. It'll be much easier working through her than having to go through Brad, at his level. Any days we can save, the better, since we're giving the Commission a REALLY short time to look at this.

Let me get back to checking things; Joan and I are going to meet at 2:30, and then we'll know more of the questions we'll have for you.

I've finished reviewing RI comments. Joan and I are going to discuss them this afternoon after I check a few things. We'll probably need to discuss some with you - don't know if we'll need John Kinniman or not - depending on what Joan says on the one comment about "cannot retain one licensee."

What's your schedule like later today or tomorrow morning? We're trying to finalize everything before Joan heads out on vacation - she's here only through noon on Friday.

Also, I'm checking into an editing review - we really don't have that anymore until it gets to FSME office level and only on the commission paper. The number of edits was related to track changes and not seeing some of that. With this very tight schedule there was not time to do a clean read on this - we were literally writing comment resolution responses up to the very last day before we had to send it out.

Also, the staff Assessment did not really change from the version that went out for public comment - I only revised the description of Pat Gardner's education. I'll go ahead and take a look at those comments and correct edits there as well. The 13.25 FTE is what NJ said was needed to run the program based on the SA-700 guidelines for evaluating that - I'll double check their language in that part of the application.
