The Department has adopted Part 61 - Licensing Requirements for land disposal of radioactive waste - by reference. Therefore, the Department now has regulations in place to regulate a LLRW facility if the need arises. New Jersey belongs to the Atlantic Compact and at the current time (and until all the nuclear power plants are decommissioned, which is at least 35 years), low-level radioactive waste disposal is not an issue for NJ licensees.

Some of the nuclear power plants in NJ may successfully receive license extensions for 20 years, and may even receive license extensions for 20 more years after that. So siting a LLRW facility may not be needed for 55 years or longer. At that time, there may be any number of other considerations, including the need to make legislative changes. While the ability to restrict land use indefinitely may be possible today, 35 - 55 years from now it will have to be reassessed.
