Dear President Jaczko,

Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant in San Luis Obispo County, California has filed for a 20 years operating license renewal. Diablo Canyon was built in a seismic area with the discovery of additional seismic faults after construction. The State of California has been conducting research into the risk of earthquake damage to this aging nuclear facility. The study is not complete.

In light of the Humboldt County M6.5 earthquake in January 2010, I urge you to wait for the completion of the research to determine if a renewal license should be granted to Diablo Canyon.

I live in the danger area as do 240,000 Californians. In the event of a seismic induced disaster at Diablo Canyon, there are basically two escape routes from the central coast, Highway 101 north and south. In the event of a nuclear disaster, traffic on this artery would come to a standstill.

Please consider waiting for the completion of the seismic study to determine if you'll grant an operating license renewal to Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant.
