This refers to your January 19, 2010, and March 1, 2010, letters notifying the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 30.36(d), that Pharmacia Corporation has made a decision to terminate license activities, and has ceased licensed activities as of the date of your letter. Based on the review of your letter regarding the radiological conditions and the anticipated decommissioning activities, the NRC has no further questions. If radiological conditions or decommissioning activities should be encountered which could change the status of your notification, please contact us immediately.

We look forward to the receipt of your final status survey. Additionally, we request that you keep us informed regarding the schedule and conduct of Remediation and survey activities being performed by your contractor. The NRC may elect to perform an inspection during these activities.



You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
