Behram:

Generally there is a procedure or at least training for construction staff so they are aware that they need to stop work if archeological artifacts are discovered. I seem to remember that this may be contained in a License Condition; I think the Crow Butte license had a discussion of the potentially eligible sites that were to be avoided and had some statement about discovery.

I do not believe that paleontological resources were assessed. This was not a requirement of NRC.
