Subject: License Amendment Request

I received a telephone call from Mike Wright of Advantage Engineers (Advantage), a newly formed engineering company located at 910 Century Drive in Mechanicsburg, PA. Mike informed me that Advantage has purchased the NRC licensed portion of the CMX business, including licensed portable gauges for measuring the physical properties of material, from CMX. Advantage acquired the locations of CMX and the Advantage offices will remain at the same addresses. CMX is an NRC licensee, license #37-30704-01, Docket 030-35895. The CMX license states that " Licensed material may be used only at temporary job sites of the licensee anywhere in the United States where the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission maintains jurisdiction for regulating the use of licensed material, including areas of exclusive Federal jurisdiction within Agreement States.." CMX also has licenses in several other states including Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey. Mr. Wright said that he is contacting the other licensing authorities as well. I informed Mr. Wright that CMX should have informed NRC of the changes prior to transferring the material, and I requested that he submit a letter to our office signed by a member of Advantage management outlining the request for a license amendment and material transfer. I also recommended that he fax the letter to the attention of Marie Miller so that we can begin to review it immediately. He stated that he will send it Monday, April 5, 2010, as his management will not be available to sign it until then. CMX may have violated the conditions of its NRC license or NRC regulations. Mr. Wright stated that the employees of CMS, himself included, were laid off without prior warning on March 12, 2010, but remained working at the facility pending the purchase of CMX operations by his superior. I also asked the status of the gauges and was informed by Mr. Wright that the licensed material has been, and remains, secured and under the control of authorized users and individuals knowledgeable of the regulations and license conditions, including himself and Eric DeRicco, the RSO named on the CMX NRC license. He also explained that all of the CMX owned locations that have licensed materials have been transferred to Advantage and that the additional locations owned by CMX will continue operating for another 30 days or so. The CMX employees at the non-licensed locations were given 60 days notice of the closing. I asked Mr. Wright for updated contact information for CMX and he agreed to ask his management for a contact person and provide it to me. This telephone conversation was provided to Marie Miller.

Action Required: Document this telephone record in ADAMS under the Docket listed above. Applicant to provide contact information regarding CMX responsible individuals. Marie Miller to forward this telephone record to the R1 Regional Agreement State Program Officers for follow-up with the appropriate Agreement States.
