Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 1, Part 110, a license is hereby issued to the licensee designated below authorizing the import of nuclear materials and/or facilities into the United States of America in accordance with the statements and representations made by the licensee in the application referenced below. This license is subject to all applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission now or hereafter in effect and to any conditions specified below.

Quantity and Type: Various materials which may be radioactively contaminated and characterized in the United States as Class A Low-Level radioactive waste including: paper, cardboard, plastics (and possibly subtypes of plastics), metals (ferrous, non-ferrous and possibly by element or alloy), cloth, rubber, wood and other items such as respirators and tools. During the term of the license, the licensee shall import no more than 30,000 pounds or approximately 5,000 cubic feet of such material at any one time.

Points of Origin: 1) Ontario Power Generation: A) Pickering Nuclear (Canada) and B) Darlington Nuclear (Canada); and 2) Bruce Power, L. P. (Canada)

End Use: All materials, which may be radioactively contaminated and imported from the Canadian entities identified herein, shall be returned to such entities pursuant to a NRC export license (e.g., XW011/01), for appropriate disposition in Canada. No materials imported pursuant to this license will remain in, or be disposed of in the United States.

Amended to: Extend expiration date from March 31, 2010 to March 31, 2020. All other conditions remain the same.
