I received a telephone call from Ed Balsavage of Advantage Engineers (Advantage), following up on the telephone conversation I had with Mike Wright of Advantage on April 1, 2010. Advantage is a newly formed engineering company located at 910 Century Drive in Mechanicsburg, PA. Ed confirmed that CMX has transferred ownership of their engineering business to Advantage, including all of CMX's licensed portable gauges for measuring the physical properties of material. Advantage acquired the Mechanicsburg office of CMX and the office will remain at the same address. CMX is an NRC licensee, license #37-30704-01, Docket 030-35895. I asked Ed if he could provide current contact information for CMX and he provided Renard Barnes, an in house attorney working with CMX to close their business. He stated that the main office of CMX is located at 200 State Highway, Manalapan, New Jersey and the contact number is 732-577-9000.

I asked Mr. Balsavage to describe the events that occurred leading up to the transfer of ownership and the gauges and whether or not the safety and security of the gauges was ever in question during the transition. Ed stated that CMX closed the Mechanicsburg office and asked him if he would like to purchase the business and the licensed portable gauges. He stated that CMX terminated their operations in Mechanicsburg, although Advantage continued to operate. Advantage employees and management continued to conduct business at the Mechanicsburg office, including maintaining the radiation safety program. He stated that CMX management conveyed to him that they wanted to ensure that their radioactive materials licensed activities were properly transferred and secured. Ed stated that the business ownership, the gauges, and the licensed program were transferred seamlessly and that the licensed materials were under the control of knowledgeable individuals at all times. Mr. Balsavage stated that he takes the regulatory requirements seriously and that he wants to ensure the process of transferring the license is done properly. He stated that all of the gauges CMX owned were transferred to the Mechanicsburg office of Advantage, including the gauges previously stored in New Jersey. Advantage did not acquire the New Jersey business from CMX but did acquire the gauges and transferred them from the CMX NJ office to Advantage's office in Mechanicsburg. He was not sure how many gauges Advantage acquired. He also stated that Advantage has prepared a request to transfer the license and will submit it to Marie Miller of R1 today via facsimile.
