Under the Freedom of Information Act I would like to request a copy of the approved suppliers list for the MOX project in Aiken, South Carolina.

Document #ML082900123, a 22-page email exchanged between D.Tikinsky and M. Kotzalas, P.Bell and K. Morrissey dated 10/07/2008 contains this list.

President Obama has instructed the heads of executive departments and agencies to renew their commitment to Open Government to emphasize the importance of transparency in a democracy.

"The Freedom of Information Act should be administered with a clear presumption: In the face of doubt, openness prevails. The Government should not keep information confidential merely because public officials might be embarrassed by disclosure, because errors and failures might be revealed, or because of speculative or abstract fears. Nondisclosure should never be based on an effort to protect the personal interests of Government officials at the expense of those they are supposed to serve. In responding to requests under the FOIA, executive branch agencies (agencies) should act promptly and in a spirit of cooperation, recognizing that such agencies are servants of the public."

I understand that this information should be provided within 20 business days of this request.
