**Purpose:**

To inquire what Sweetwater County knows about UR-Energy's proposed ISL facility at Lost Creek, and what concerns they may have about such a facility being constructed and operated in their county.

**Discussion:**

- SC was told by UR-Energy last fall (2008) that they were going to process 'dry' yellowcake, not a 'wet' slurry (contrary to what their permit application indicates)
- Concerns that SC & TOB has about the Lost Creek facility:
  - Water quality – especially for the TOB
  - Transportation – especially rad issues
    - What roads would be used?
    - Who would maintain the roads?
    - Who would provide the upgrades?
  - Stormwater Management – an engineering issue
  - Overall safety
  - Housing
    - Nothing available in Bairoil
    - A 'man-camp' is for sale by BP in Wamsutter
  - Emergency Management
    - No 'hard' telephone lines exist
    - Cell phone service is 'spotty'
    - Wamsutter is 45 mi
    - Bairoil is 25 mi
- WY DOT is responsible for all rad accidents (Joe Lewis is the POC 307-352-3100)

- SC is entirely zoned – even Federal land (Lost Creek site is zoned 'Agricultural')
- Waste Management
  - There is a transfer site in Bairoil
  - A landfill exists in Wamsutter
- Lost Creek would have to do their own hauling
- Fire Department wants a Hazmat inventory

**Action Items:**

- NRC to find out what the final product would be at the Lost Creek facility (wet or dry yellowcake)
- NRC to find out which roads would be used
- NRC to find out:
  - Type of radiation
  - Levels of radiation at different locations
  - Types of containers
