Dear Chairman Jaczko:

As Congress and the Administration consider an expanded role for nuclear power in our national energy portfolio, it is essential to ensure public trust in the NRC as a guarantor of nuclear safety. As you know, I have ongoing concerns about the adequacy of the Commission's fire safety enforcement at nuclear facilities, and I am writing to inquire about the status of your efforts in this area.

In 2008, the Government Accountability Office issued a report which found that the NRC was not enforcing its own fire safety standards, and the NRC Inspector General found that the Commission had ignored evidence that the fire safety insulation used by some plants was not adequate. In light of these findings, Congress included language in the Fiscal Year 2009 Omnibus Appropriations bill directing the Commission to ensure that the new risk-based fire protection standards (NFPA 805) are developed in a transparent manner and subject to peer review. The NRC was also asked to report to Congress on the status of all licensee compliance with either the new NFPA 805 regulations or existing fire safety requirements.

In a May 2009 report, NRC responded with confidence about the adequacy of fire safety standards at all nuclear facilities. However, the report also stated that "it is the NRC's goal to have licensees in compliance with the regulations without reliance on compensatory measures." Can you update me on the status of the Commission's efforts in this regard? In particular, I would like to know the status of the fire safety pilot projects and the timeline for licensees to comply with the new risk-based measures, as well as the implementation of any necessary regulatory changes.

In addition, there is continued concern in my congressional district among local elected officials, advocates, and members of the public, about the NFPA 805 regulations being implemented as part of the risk-based measure pilot program at the Shearon Harris nuclear plant in North Carolina. I appreciate your taking time to meet personally with some of my constituents to discuss the NFPA 805 program in depth, and I would ask that you respond to the concerns they have raised expeditiously.
