Behram,

Jon is gone for the day and will be out of the office tomorrow and Friday, so I thought I would pass on the following information we have received regarding the Casper and Midwest/Edgerton, Wyoming landfills. This information comes from Patrick Troxel, District Manager of the WDEQ Solid and Hazardous Waste Division that covers Natrona County, Wyoming, where both landfills are located. If you would care to speak directly with Patrick, his number in Lander, WY is (307) 335-6950.

- The Midwest/Edgerton landfill is indeed closing this year, and perhaps very soon. Midwest/Edgerton has, however, permitted a transfer facility whereby they will collect garbage in Midwest then transfer it to the City of Casper landfill (balefill facility). There is a possibility that the solid waste from Moore Ranch can still be transferred to Midwest, and from that point transferred to Casper.
- The City of Casper has a landfill permit that makes them the largest permitted landfill in the U.S. (other than New York City perhaps) on an acreage/volume basis (1,200 surface acres and 300 feet deep). Phase I of the landfill (where they have started working) has a life expectancy of 50 years and will hold 11.9 million cubic yards of waste. The entire permitted landfill has a life expectancy of 1,400 years based on a permitted volume of 414 million cubic yards of waste and expected growth of Wyoming. Casper is expected to become the final disposal site for many smaller communities who permit transfer stations rather than operate their own landfills.

Based on the above, I do not think that our Moore Ranch operation will be constrained by capacity at the Casper solid waste facility. We'll just be a drop in the bucket!
