Enclosed is Amendment No. 01 to your NRC Material License No. 12-32746-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions and changes made. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887.

In correspondence dated December 31, 2009 you indicated that you wished to release for unrestricted use a former address and area of use located at 74 Algana Court, St Peters, Missouri.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed former address and area of use. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for this address/area of use and it is suitable for unrestricted use.

Please note, we changed Subitem Nos. 9.C and 9.D to limit your possession to one CPN International Model MC Series PORTAPROBE® gauging device. The possession limits on your material license do not allow possession of more than one device.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records (PARS) component of NRC's document system (ADAMS). The NRC's document system is accessible from the NRC Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html (the Public Electronic Reading Room).

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
